
# The Circular February 2025

#### Love's Labour's Lost (more or less)

As you read this, our co-producers over the border in Prescot, Shakespeare North Playhouse, are about to open our latest show Love's Labour's Lost (more or less).

We can't wait to see what audiences over the Pennines think of this colourful, uplifting show, packed with gags and great music. It promises to be at least as much fun as its predecessor, The Comedy of Errors (more or less), which so many of you loved two years ago.

Love's Labour's Lost (more or less) is at Shakespeare North Playhouse from 28 February to 22 March, then is in our Round from 27 March to 19 April.

## Education, Education, Education

Last year's starkly excellent *DNA*, the first show from our newly formed Young Company, was an absolutely stunner. Come and support the stars of the future again in this year's Young Company show, *Education*, *Education*, in our Round from 11 to 15 March.

The group is designed for aspiring young theatre makers actively pursuing a career in the performing arts. Whether they're applying for a place in higher education, studying, or at the start of their career, it's the perfect place to grow their knowledge and understanding of a career as a professional theatre maker. They deepen awareness of a range of theatre practices through exploring text, making work for a public performance, and devising new work that reflects their lived experience.

effects - Dad's Army Radio Show brings the classic BBC comedy to life in this highly acclaimed stage production. Three episodes of the popular sitcom, adapted for radio for the very first time, are hilariously and lovingly enacted on stage by two master performers - complete with sound effects, vintage music and all your favourite Perry and Croft characters and catchphrases.

Then in the autumn, we're delighted to welcome

back the ever-popular John Godber Company with their latest show, Black Tie Ball – it's in the Round from Wednesday 12 to Saturday 15 November.

It's the glitziest night of the year, and everyone wants to be there, from the great to the good. The Bentleys are parked, the jazz band has arrived, and the magician is magic, so pick

up your invite for this fundraising frenzy.

But behind the bow ties and fake tans there are jealousies and avarice, divorces and affairs: upstairs meets downstairs through a drunken gaze. The raffle is ready, the coffee is cold, the service is awful, the guest speaker is drunk, and the hard-pressed caterers just want to go home.

Told in Godber's signature visceral style, this hilarious comedy sees the hotel staff recount an entire evening at breakneck speed, from arrival at seven to carriages at midnight. Being short staffed has never been so funny!

## Heading our way in March...

Our March programme is dominated by Love's Labour's Lost (more or less), but that doesn't mean we can't squeeze in a couple of superb visiting shows...

Velma Celli (13 March): Do you love a diva? Then you won't want to miss God Save the Queens, the new show from Yorkshire's very own drag superstar, Velma Celli.



Velma is the alter ego of York-born musicals star lan Stroughair, who spent 20 years performing in shows such as Cats, Fame, Rent and Chicago – he played tabloid journalist Mary Sunshine alongside Jerry Springer as Billy Flynn in a West End production of the latter (wonder where the

inspiration for his drag name came from?). Velma will be celebrating some great British music icons from across the years, with a set list that includes medleys of songs by Adele and Julie Andrews, and numbers by Amy Winehouse, Jessie J, Sinead O'Connor, Kate Bush, Dusty Springfield, George Michael, Bonnie Tyler, Cilla Black and Shirley Bassey.

The BBC's flagship topical comedy show, The News Quiz, is coming to Scarborough! We're delighted that they'll be



recording in The Round on Thursday 27 February.
